

He is drawing students to Himself, and showing up in amazing ways.



It was a privilege to be an assistant coach this fall, and to dream about my involvement in the future. With my teaching, I have been able to settle into my role as both a Math and Science teacher. some friends. She left early Saturday morning and got back late Sunday night, but had a wonderful 24 hours in Weimar for a ladies Sauna night, to visit our home church Weimar EFG, and to see some other dear friends. It was a refreshing time for her, but also felt good coming home to Kandern.

Stanley continues to grow and mature into a wonderful young man. BFA has very strong academic checks for missing work, so Stanley has been in and out of the Academic Work Room, but the teacher in charge commented the other day of how respectful and well spoken Stanley is in all of their interactions. Stanley feels like he is finding his place within his class and the community. He did switch small groups in November, but this was a really good move for him, as he didn't mesh very well with his original group.

One of our big changes coming up is that we are looking at adopting a dog from within the Kandern community group. This has been Stanley's dream his whole life, and he is really excited about welcoming Jake into our home. Jake is a 9 yr old Golden Retriever who is well trained, but needed a new home for various reasons. This will be an adjustment for our family, but one that we have been praying about for a long time.

Holly had her "Lion, Witch, and the Wardrobe" performance at the beginning of November. She played Lucy Pevensie and did a marvelous job. She received so many encouraging comments, from friends and community members. It was a great growing experience for her and she rose to the challenge amazingly. Now she is starting basketball, and is enjoying the practices and new skills that she is learning. She continues to develop new friendships, and has found a great group of girls that she enjoys hanging out with.













Stuart and Samuel are continuing to do well in their respective schools. We just celebrated Stuart's 10th birthday, and we are so thankful for this kid. Stuart loves his teachers at his German school for kids with special

needs., and has been recommended for an integrative school at a German Gymnasium for next year. For those of you who are not familiar with this, the German school system has students streamed at the beginning of fifth grade. The Gymnasium track is for students who are University bound and is more academic in nature. An integrative school is where students with special needs are blended with neurotypical kids. For academic classes such as Math, English, and Science the kids with special needs will be pulled out for their own lessons, but during other parts of the day all the kids will be together for various activities. This is such a blessing for Stuart as he is very social and loved, but not able to do the academics. The school Stuart will be at is also a Christian school, the same denomination as our church.



Samuel has been making lots of friends at his school, and has been working very hard. He is a bit of a perfectionist, which causes him to be very slow and meticulous with his work. His German continues to improve and he is feeling more confident in being able to communicate at school and at church.

As we move closer to Christmas, we are looking forward to three weeks off, and a visit from my parents (Steve and Sue). We are hoping to check out some of the local Christmas Markets. We are excited for our first Christmas in Kandern, and the wonderful memories that will be made. Here are some prayer requests.
