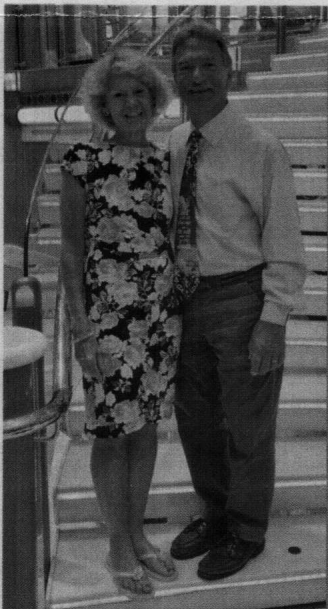

A Liaison Couple for Be One Together Ministries

In October 2023, we were asked to become one of the liaison couples of the ministry that we are part of, Be One Together. You might ask, "What is a liaison couple?" Well, we asked the same question. As the Lord blesses the ministry of Be One Together and more missionaries start serving God through it, all over the United States and the world, missionaries might feel like they are ministering on their own. As liaisons, we strive to help care for, support, encourage, pray for, and visit with (by zoom or in person) nine missionary couples/individuals that are serving our Lord across the United States. During our 6,000 mile visitation trip in the fall of 2024, we had the pleasure of visiting missionaries in person in Virginia, North Carolina, Tennessee, and later that fall, one in Wyoming and one in Idaho. This past February, during our Mexico Mission Trip (see page three for more details), we visited two more missionaries in Texas and one in Louisiana. We still have one more couple that we are looking forward to meeting in person in Oregon. Please be in prayer, not only for Sandy and I, but for all the missionaries serving with Be One Together that are listed at beonetgether.com.

VBS (Vacation Bible School) is one of the best ways to introduce a child to receive Jesus as their Lord and Savior, live a life filled with following Him, and be trained up in the way that they should go. The month of June, for us and many others, is usually filled with preparing and doing VBS. In June 2025, we were involved with two different programs. We are so grateful and thankful to the churches for the opportunities, and we praise the Lord for changed lives in the children.

Inkom/Marsh Valley VBS

The first one was a combination of Marsh Valley Bible Church and Inkom Community Bible Church. I was asked to be the Bible teacher and Sandy to be the crafts/science teacher. We so enjoy sharing The Good News of Jesus Christ with the children that attend. This year's lessons were from Answers In Genesis, on Jesus' birth, life, death, and resurrection, with an Old West and train theme. As you can see, Sandy loves to dress up according to the lessons that she is teaching each day, and the children love it, too. The week was filled with Bible lessons,



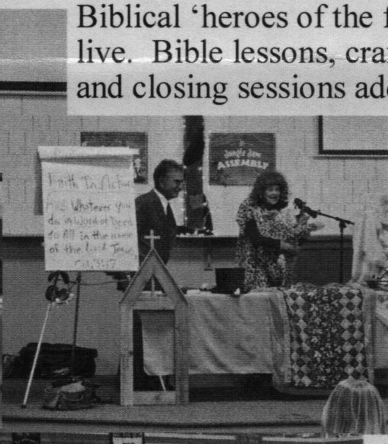
crafts, science classes, games, snacks, memory verses, and opening and closing sessions. About 40 + children attended each day.



Roberts VBS

The second one was at the Roberts Community Church. We were asked to share each day, during the opening session, about what a missionary is. We shared that missionaries are believers in Jesus Christ that do many different things as they teach, train, share, play, work, and live for God. By the end of the week, we taught the children that anyone that has given their life to Jesus is a missionary and should share the Good News of Jesus

Christ with everyone around them. The lessons were on five different Biblical 'heroes of the faith' and that they are examples for us of how to live. Bible lessons, crafts, games, snacks, memory verses, and opening and closing sessions added to the theme and fun of the week.

Mexico Mission Trip With Netmenders Ministry 2025 Plus...

This past February included much more than Mexico: 4,679 miles, 30 days away from home, 17 different beds, eight days of ministering in Mexico, one day of flying to Indiana, five days of Biblical Counseling Training paid for by Be One Together for our benefit as a liaison couple of the ministry, one day of flying back to Texas, and seven days of visitation to Be One Together missionaries in Texas, one in Louisiana, and one YWAM missionary in Texas. I was asked to lead a team that worked at the Templo Monte Sinai Church in Nuevo Progreso, Mexico. In 2024, we tore the old roof off and replaced it with a new roof, but the church needed a ceiling and insulation because of the intense heat in the summer. Some of the people from the church, and a team from Netmenders, hung the metal supports, sheetrock, insulation, and lights. By the end of the week, the church had a ceiling ready to be painted. As usual, the week was filled with many other projects worked on by Netmender volunteers in Texas and Mexico, including a festival and medical clinic for the people in the town that Sandy also helped at. This allows the people to see God's love in action at the churches. During the festival, a meal was served, food was handed out to take home, and games for all ages were played. At the clinic, people were prayed for and received free medical care. If this sounds like something that the Lord would have you do, there is still room for the 2026 Netmender's Mission trip. This year's trip is Feb. 1st - 7th. You can contact Sandy or myself for more information, and we can put you in contact with the leaders of the ministry. We would love to have you come and share the Good News of Jesus!



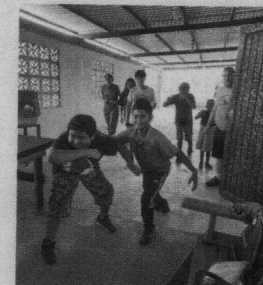

A wonderful chaplain opportunity for Sandy to help with 'Shop with a Cop'

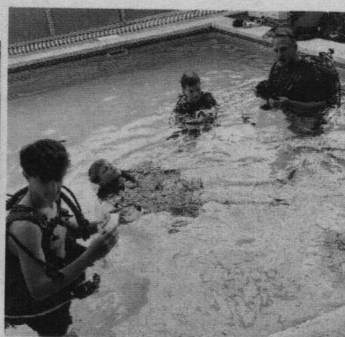
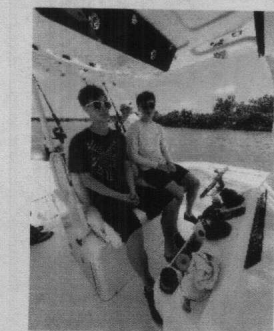
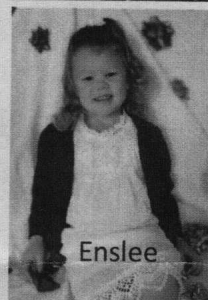
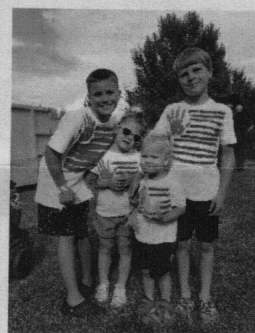
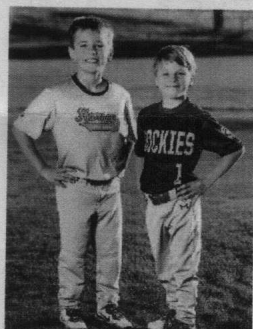
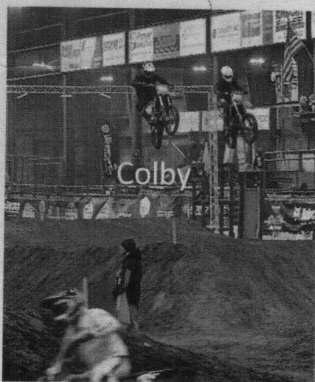
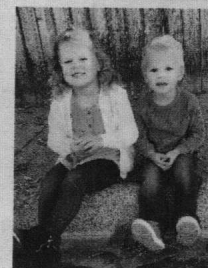
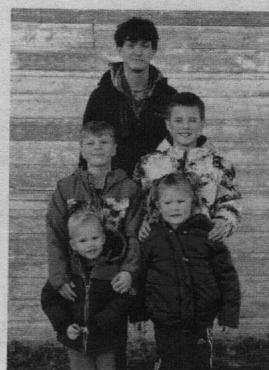
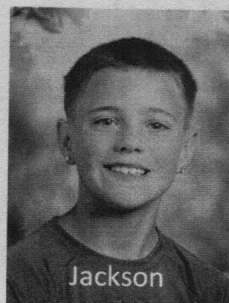
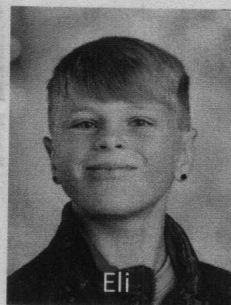
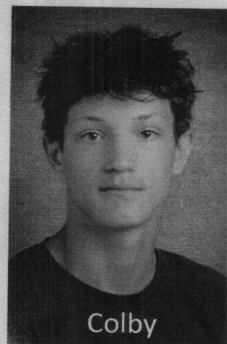
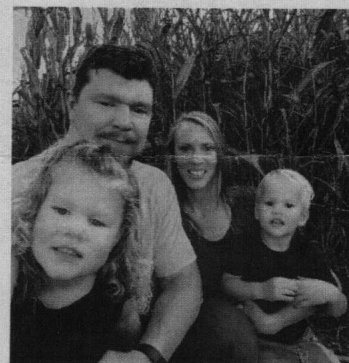
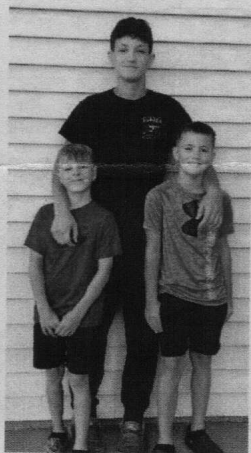
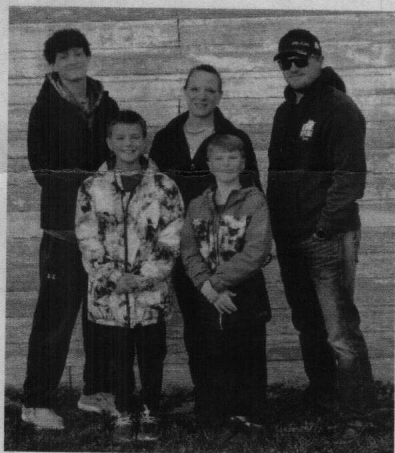

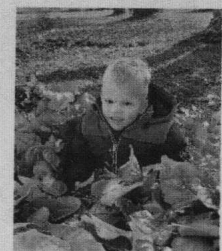
